

MOSSAIC Program Payment Options

I. Direct Speech/Language Services

- Insurance. A prescription must be obtained from your physician.
- Direct pay. Currently the DeWit RiteCare charges \$130 per individual session or \$65 for group sessions.
- Scholarships are available based on financial need. Scholarship forms are provided upon request and will offset the cost of intervention upon approval.

To participate in any portion of the remaining offerings below, participants pay a \$20 materials fee per semester upon the completion of an intake form.

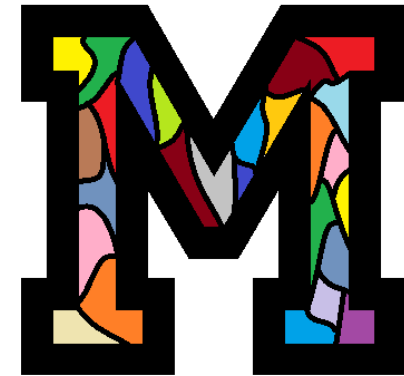

The MOSSAIC Tesserae

I. Direct Speech/Language Services

Direct services support the participants in their areas of need, in turn supporting their role in the community including:

- Social skills
- Academic support such as written language, language and reading comprehension, language expression, etc.
- Executive functioning skills to support time management, initiation, organization, self advocacy, etc.
- Employment readiness skills using evidence based interventions

II. Peer Mentoring

- Peer coaching to help navigate the campus and systems within the UM program. Peers are juniors and seniors in the CSD department.



III. Social Evenings

- Two times a month we offer a social evening with food and activities. Adult members of the community with autism or related disorders are invited to join us.

IV. Ed Ready Support

- Peers support MOSSAIC participants as they navigate the EdReady Montana math preparation program.

V. Academic Support

- In some instances we have a CSD undergraduate who is enrolled in the same class as a MOSSAIC participant. If possible, the peer will attend class with the participant and assist with areas of need as a mentor.
