- Explore transfer of rights & guardianship.
- Apply for SSI redetermination.
- Explore options for adult mental health services.
- Identify & refer to adult resources.
- After graduation, secure housing
   & pursue vocational/educational
   goals.

*Age 15-16:*

- Prepare your own statements for your IEP and attend IEP meetings.

- Explore career interests and potential life goals.
- Build communications skills.
- build independent living skills.
- Learn about your medication.
- Discuss transfer of rights & guardianship.
- Identify transportation needs and options



# Junior/Senior

Age 17-18

- Update your file of high school & disability records.
- Refine post high school goals.
- Identify post high school resources from adult agencies & begin filling out available applications.
- Identify post high school support team.
- During your senior year, participate in completing the IEP Summary of Performance document.
- Firm up career interests & potential life goals.
- Explore college or employment options.
- If college focused, explore TRIO program.
- Participate in a school & community based work experience.
- Pursue adult diagnosis— at age 17.
- Prepare for Social Security application or redetermination.
- ♦ Clarify transportation needs.
- Explore transfer of rights & guardianship.
- Learn about medical coverage rules & options.

Age 18 and Up
